Why does Botswana need solar power?

Botswana is seeking a reliable and cost-effective electricity source,as hydropower is no longer viable due to droughts [Why does Botswana need solar power?]. To encourage the adoption of PV systems,Botswana imposes 20% import duties on solar lights and lanterns (and 5% on solar batteries),and offers net-metering for rooftop installations.

How will Scatec power plant work in Botswana?

The power plant is Scatec's first in Botswana and will generate predictable revenues from a 25-year power purchase agreement(PPA) with Botswana Power Corporation,the national utility. The remaining 60 MW of the project is currently under construction and is expected to be completed in the beginning of 2026.
